1) Be knowledgeable:

To become a good teacher a person must have expertise/command over the subject, i.e. well-researched and updated knowledge of the subject.

2) Be resourceful:

A good teacher is very resourceful and to be one, a person should have sufficient material and all the required tools to aid in the learning of his/her students.

3) Stay aware about his/her students:

A student feels most comfortable when his/her teacher is well informed and can comprehend strengths and areas that the need guidance, well. It also enables the teacher to customize

his/her teaching according to the student's capabilities in the best possible way. Another important quality is that of being patient, as every child has a unique learning pattern and pace of grasping information.
